THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA
PART IVA - Fundamental Duties

ARTICLE 51A

- Fundamental Duties - It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-
(a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
(b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
(c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
(d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
(e) to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
(f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
(g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, wild life and to have compassion for living creatures;
(h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
(i) to safeguard public property and to eschew violence;
(j) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the Nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement;
(k) who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or, as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years (Eighty-sixth Amendment).

(2) In the Year 2022, the following festivals/occasions fall on Sundays which are public holidays under N. I. Act. and hence have not been included in the lists: (i) Birth Day of Netaji (23rd January), (ii) Birth Day of Shri Shri Harichand Thakur (10th April), (iii) May Day (1st May), (iv) Id-ud-Zoha (Bakrid) (10th July), (v) Mahalaya (25th September), (vi) Birth Day of Gandhiji (2nd October), (vii) Durga Puja, Saptami (2nd October), (viii) Fatcha-Dwaz-Daham (9th October), (ix) Lakshmi Puja (9th October), (x) Chhat Puja (30th October), (xi) Christmas Day (25th December). (3) The holidays with double asterisk marks [i.e., (**)] is applicable to those Government Offices only where Saturdays are not observed as full holiday. (4) General Instructions as laid down hereunder are to be followed in case of Muslim festivals.

General Instructions to be followed in all types of Holidays including Holidays for the Muslim Festivals. (1) No substitute holiday shall be allowed if any of the festival - holidays initially notified subsequently happens to fall on a weekly off or any other non-working day or in the event of more than one festival falling on the same day. (2) If there is any change in the date of Eid-UL-Fitr, Id-ud-Zoha, Muharram, Fatcha-Dwaz-Daham and Shab-e-Barat depending upon the sighting of the moon, holiday will be declared by a separate order for the date on which the festival would be actually observed in lieu of the date originally notified as holiday for this festival. (3) It may happen that the change of date of above mentioned occasions has to be notified at a very short notice. In such a situation, announcement would be made through TV/A.I.R./News Papers, Heads of Department/Offices of the State Government may take action according to such announcements without waiting for formal order about the change of date.

Public Holidays under the Negotiable Instruments Act., 1881.
Applicable to those Government Offices where Saturdays are not observed as full holidays.
Government Offices including Treasuries and Sub-Treasuries will remain open on 1st April and 30th September, which have been declared as Public Holidays under N. I. Act., 1881.
