It was clear to Burns that he had talent enough to make a fortune, or a hundred fortunes could he but have rightfully willed this; it was clear also that he willed something far different, and therefore would not make one. Unhappy it was that he had not power to choose the one, and reject the other; but must halt for ever between two opinions, two objects, making hampered advancement towards either. But so it is with many men; we 'long for merchandise, yet would fain keep the price'; and so stand chaffering with Fate, in vexatious altercation, till the night come and our fair is over!

Burns was born poor; and born also to continue poor, for he could not endeavour to be otherwise : this had been well could he have once for all admitted and considered it as finally settled. He was poor truly but hundreds even of his own class and order of minds have been poorer, yet have suffered nothing deadly from it; nay, his own father had a far sorer battle with ungrateful destiny than his was; and he did not yield to it, but died courageously warring, and to all moral intents prevailing, against it. Truc Burns had little means, had even little time for poetry, his only real pursuit and vocation; but so much the more precious was what little he had. In all these external respects his case was hard, but very far from the hardest. Poverty, incessant drudgery, and much worse evils, it has often the lot of poets and wise men to strive with, and their glory to conquer. Locke was banished as a traitor; and wrote his 'Essay on the Human Understanding' sheltering himself in a Dutch garret. Was Milton rich or at his ease when he composed 'Paradise Lost'? Not only low, but fallen from a height; not only poor, but impoverished; in darkness and with danger compassed around, he sang his immortal song, and found fit audience though few. Did not Cervantes finish his work, a maimed soldier and in prison? Nay, was not 'Araucana' which Spain acknowledges its best epic, written without even the aid of paper, on scraps of leather, as the stout fighter and voyager snatched any moment from that wild warfare?

And what, then, had these men, which Burns wanted? Two things, both which, it seems to us, are indispensable for such men. They had a true principle of morals; and a single, not double aim in their activity. They were not self-seekers and self-worshippers; but seekers and worshippers of something far better than Self. Not personal enjoyment was their object; but a high, heroic idea of religion or patriotism, of heavenly Wisdom, in one or the other form, ever hovered before them, in which cause they neither shrank from suffering nor called on the earth to witness it as something wonderful; but patiently endured, counting it blessedness enough so to spend and be spent. Thus the golden calf of 'Self-love', however curiously carved, was not their Deity; but the Invisible Goodness, which alone is man's reasonable service. This feeling was a celestial fountain, whose streams refreshed into gladness and beauty all the provinces of their otherwise too desolate existence. In a word, he willed one thing to which all other things were subordinate and made subservient; and therefore they accomplished it. The wedge will rend rocks but its edge must be sharp and single; if it be double, the wedge is bruised in pieces and will rend nothing.
