Contrary to the popular view, tanning is not a free beauty bonus handed out by nature nor a sign of bursting health. It is merely part of the body's defence against potentially destructive ultra-violet rays. And while moderate exposure of the skin to sunlight is necessary for health - as well as providing a psychological boost-over-exposure can result in painful burns, solar dermatitis and even skin cancer.

Continual and excessive exposure to direct sunlight also ages the skin as it thickens up, and wrinkles and sags more quickly due to loss of elasticity. A good sunscreen - for a hot summer at home as well as heat abroad - is therefore essential for any woman concerned about her appearance and skin condition.

Despite claims by cosmetic firms, no product is yet available which will permit bronzing while eradicating all risk of burning, since true tanning begins only while the skin is being burned. When direct sunlight bathes the body, skin begins thickening to filter out some of the potentially damaging rays while the anti-sunburn pigment, melanin, is being rushed to the upper skin layers to absorb sunlight. Hence a good sunscreen, coupled with slow and gradual exposure to sun, produces painless tanning with a minimum of burning.

Individuals vary in their ability to cope with sunlight even when the skin is well protected. But, as a rough guide, the fair-skinned should toast only for about 20 minutes and afternoon initially. Other points to note are: that burning takes place more quickly between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m., when the sun is overhead; that reflections from water, sand or snow intensify sunlight; and that reflection can cause bad burns even on a seemingly dull and cloudy day near the sea or up in the mountains.

The art of self-protection lies not only in choosing sunscreens but also in using them properly. Initially they all need to be applied at regular intervals, spread meticulously over all exposed sections. They should always be reapplied after swimming.

Many of the people who formulate sun products believe that a sunscreen oil provides the maximum protection in both heat and cold for most skins. This is because oils form a continuous film; they are not easily dispersed by water or perspiration; and unlike creams, which may contain a high proportion of water, they cannot dry out in sun or wind. And since the softening effect of the oil compensates for any possible irritant effects from the sun-screening agent, it could well be the best choice for those who suffer from cosmetic allergies.
